Requirements for the Trail of the Saber

In order to receive the Trail of the Saber award the following requirements must be met. Once complete, an [application](#) must be submitted to the National Royal Rangers Office for processing.

<i>Category</i>	<i>Requirements</i>
Leadership Merits	Earn eight (8) leadership merits of any color (red, gold, or sky blue).
District Camps	Complete two district junior leadership training events , beginning with Junior Training Camp (JTC) or above. Complete one additional district training event or an Action Camp. Serve as a junior staff member at one or more district junior training camps OR attend one additional district training event or an additional Action Camp.
Reading	Read the leadership distinctive for all 18 leadership merits (72 distinctive in all). These may be found in the book entitled <i>A Guy's Journey to Servant Leadership</i> by Doug Marsh or on TRaCclub. Read the book Next Generation Leader by Andy Stanley.
Age	Be at least 14 years of age and a graduate of the 9th grade. Must be earned before reaching 18 years of age.

DEVOTION: KINGDOM LIVING

Matthew 16:28 some standing here, which shall not taste of death, till they see the Son coming in His Kingdom

& Luke 9:27 But I tell you the truth, there be some standing here, will see the Kingdom of God.

Both scripture record this very important fact of when this Kingdom was to come, or had come. Do you think maybe some were going to die while others lived on to see? Or maybe they would all live on, but it is just that even though still alive they would not see the Kingdom for some reason or another while others could, and did so? And why could they not as some did, is a good question for the heart!

So what about the concept of the Kingdom of God being in our hearts? The Scriptures show that this subject should be on our minds. After all, we are supposed to pray for the Kingdom to come (Matthew 6:10) and Jesus told us to "[seek first the kingdom of God](#) and His righteousness" (verse 33).

When we repent of our sins, are baptized and begin following the lead of the Holy Spirit, we voluntarily place ourselves under the laws and authority of the present and coming Kingdom of God.

Describing this process, Paul, who was being held prisoner in Rome at the time, explained, "He [God, the Father] has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love" (Colossians 1:13). So there is a sense of us being symbolically "conveyed," "translated" (King James Version) or "transferred" (English Standard Version) into the Kingdom when we commit our lives to God and begin living as He instructs.

Our primary allegiance is transferred from all kingdoms of this world to God's Kingdom. We are then subject to different laws (God's laws) and belong to a different community ([the Church](#) of God).

3 THINGS HOLY SPIRIT PERFORMS IN THE BORN AGAIN BELIEVER.

- 1) Regenerates. (Titus 3:5: "He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.")

The [Holy Spirit](#) helps us obey God's laws. This spirit "of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7) gives us the ability to live by God's laws even though we are still human with human weaknesses. Those who are led by the Spirit of God are called the "sons of God" (Romans 8:14). This same spirit empowers the Church to fulfill its commission. In this sense, we have the opportunity to taste or experience "the powers of the age to come" (Hebrews 6:4-5,12).

- 2) In Dwells. (1 Corinthians 6:19: "Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own.") Even though the Bible speaks of our "citizenship" as being in heaven after we are baptized (Philippians 3:20), in order to enter the Kingdom of God, humans must be changed from flesh and blood into spirit, from mortal into immortal, at Jesus' second coming (1 Corinthians 15:50-53; Hebrews 9:28). When the Kingdom of God comes to earth, it will rule over all the "kingdoms of this world" (Revelation 11:15).

3) Seals. (Ephesians 1:13-14: "And you also were included in Christ when you heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation. When you believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession.

Ephesians 4:30 And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Unfortunately, in reading Jesus' statement that "the kingdom of God is within you," many have mistakenly limited the Kingdom of God to a philosophical perspective or a way of thinking. In reality, the coming Kingdom of God is far more than what is just in the hearts and minds of Jesus' followers. The question we started out with, and why not? In fact; Simply, what the Lord has been saying to us, in the first place, is that He desires to have, and must have—and therefore He can have in this dispensation a people with their eyes open, a seeing people who have the faculty in themselves.' And this is that day; we are in the day of the prophets' fulfilled vision!

These are not merely words and great ideas. It has to be true of you, even though it may be only at its beginnings, that the apprehension of Jesus Christ in your heart is tremendous, is overwhelming. He, (Christ Jesus) is your vision, and He has master you in the sense of His greatness. We shall never get through without vision. We shall break if we have no vision, or if our vision is arrested, (Proverbs 29:18). If something interferes with the clearness, the fullness, of our vision, we shall begin to go around in circles, not knowing where we are. The vision will carry us on if it keeps clear and full. Have you got that?

When the Holy Spirit came on the day of Pentecost, this tremendous thing happened—they saw the Lord, and in seeing Him they began to be emancipated from everything that was other or less than He. Those who did not see, well they began to pass out and either became nonentities in the spiritual realm or of their prejudices, enemies to those who saw. The instance in John 9 was fulfilled in a spiritual sense. The Lord opened the eyes of the blind man born blind. What happen? The others cast him out. Those who saw in the day of the Spirit's coming were excommunicated by many who were prejudiced. They were cut off. There is always a price attached to seeing!
